DRIVING IN UTAH:

- Right-hand driving.
- Speed limits: 65-80 mph on highways, 55 mph on rural roads, and 20-25 mph in urban areas. Follow the signs.
- Alcohol Limit: Maximum blood alcohol level = 0.05% (0.5 g/L).
- Headlights: Required at all times while driving.
- Right turns are permitted at red lights after coming to a complete stop, unless otherwise indicated by a posted sign.

CLIMATE:

Utah has four distinct seasons, with significant variations in temperature depending on altitude and region:

- Winter (Dec–Feb): Cold, especially in the mountains. Avg. temps: 30°F – 40°F (-1°C – 4°C). Heavy snowfall in higher elevations.
- Spring (Mar–May): Mild but variable. Avg. temps: 40°F – 60°F (5°C – 15°C). Moderate precipitation.
- Summer (Jun–Aug): Hot and dry. Avg. temps: 80°F – 95°F (25°C – 35°C). Peak tourist season.
- Autumn (Sep–Nov): Pleasant temperatures with little rain. Best months to visit: September & October.

PREPARING YOUR TRIP

ESSENTIAL DOCUMENTS:

- Valid passport or ID card
- Disability Identification card
- Disabled Parking card
- Driver's license
- Medical treatments Prescription

VISA:

Citizens from Australia, the UK, and Canada do not need a visa for stays under 90 days. However, they must obtain an ESTA (Electronic System for Travel Authorization) before entering the U.S.

HEALTH & INSURANCE:

It is recommended to be up-to-date with your vaccinations. COVID-19 entry requirements may change. Check the U.S. embassy website of your home country before traveling.

Healthcare in the U.S. is expensive. Some credit cards include travel insurance; check with your provider. Otherwise, purchasing travel insurance is strongly advised to cover:

- Medical emergencies
- Lost/stolen luggage
- Trip cancellations

ELECTRICITY & ADAPTERS:

In the USA and Canada, voltage and frequency (110 V, 60 Hz) differ from those in Australia and England. Electrical appliances in Australia and England will require an adapter, unlike those in Canada. Type I plugs (used in Australia) and Type G plugs (used in the UK) are not compatible with American plugs, which are type A or B.

If your devices are not labeled "INPUT: 100-240V, 50/60Hz," you'll need a power converter to avoid damage.

AIRPORT:

Utah has an international airport in Salt Lake City. Las Vegas may also be an option. Both are fully equipped to accommodate people with reduced mobility.

ASSISTANCE AT THE AIRPORT:

If you choose to fly, remember to ask for assistance no later than 48 hours before your trip. This service is free for anyone with reduced mobility. Depending on your needs, this service provides assistance with navigating the terminal, checking in, boarding, and collecting luggage upon arrival.

This botanical garden is dedicated to the conservation and presentation of the desert flora of the American Southwest, featuring over 5,000 plant species.

Snow Canyon State Park:

The area is famous for its red rock landscapes, petrified sand dunes and lava flows.

There are two ways to enjoy the park, the best of which is to take the Whiptail, a trail about 6-mile (10 km) long. It starts at the park's southern entrance and ends at Upper Gallot Picnic. It's also possible to explore the park by car, stopping off at the various parking lots along the main road.

Accessibility:

- Disabled parking available at Pioneer Names and Camp Ground Picnic
- Accessible restroom at Sand Dune Picnic, Camp Ground Picnic and Lower Galoot Picnic
- Marked relief in some places
- Asphalted floor
- Handbike with assistance or motorized wheel strongly recommended

Don't miss the panoramic viewpoint just outside the park.

MAIN ATTRACTIONS:



Zion National Park:

Zion National Park is Utah's first national park (est. 1919), known for its stunning canyons, towering cliffs, and unique rock formations.

We recommend that you go to the Visitor Center to obtain your barrier access code. On presentation of your disability card, you will then be able to access certain sites with your vehicle.

There are many ways to enjoy this park:

- Zion Museum of Human History

Accessibility:

- Disabled parking available
- Accessible restroom

- Pa'rus Trail: this 5.6 km trail follows the Virgin River. It offers magnificent views of the park's characteristic red sandstone walls.

Accessibility:

- A bit of relief, asphalt floor
- All-terrain wheels and assistance recommended

- Temple of Sinawava: The trail follows the majestic sandstone walls that hug the Virgin River.

Accessibility:

- Disabled parking available
- Accessible restroom
- Marked relief, concrete floor
- All-terrain wheel and obligatory assistance

- Viewpoints Big bend and Court of the patriarchs

Accessibility:

- No relief, concrete floor

- The road to the eastern exit of the park offers some very fine views, with the possibility of stopping.

BRYCE CANYON & SURROUNDINGS

MAIN ATTRACTIONS:



Bryce Canyon National Park:

Bryce Canyon is home to thousands of unique rock formations called “hoodoos,” formed by millions of years of erosion. The park is at an altitude of 2,500 meters, so it can be cold even in summer.

Visitor's center:

Accessibility:

- Disabled parking available
- Accessible restroom

The park is mainly visited from viewpoints:

- Sunset and sunrise point: two of the most beautiful spots in the park. Park at sunset point and walk towards sunrise point. The latter is elevated and the access ramp is very steep.

Accessibility:

- Disabled parking available
- Accessible restroom
- A bit of relief, concrete floor followed by compacted dirt
- All other viewpoints are accessible.

Accessibility:

- Disabled parking available
- Accessible restrooms at Farview Point and Yovimpa-Rainbow point
- Little or no relief
- Concrete or compacted dirt floor

CAPITOL REEF & SURROUNDING

MAIN ATTRACTIONS:



Capitol Reef National Park:

Location: [click on this link](#)

The name derives from the monumental shape of certain rocks from an ancient coral reef that existed here millions of years ago.

Visitor's center:

Accessibility:

- Disabled parking available
- Accessible restroom

The panoramic road is accessible by car. This dirt road offers a beautiful view of the park's rock formations.

You can also see Petroglyphs representing the Fremont nation.

Accessibility:

- No relief, floor made of wooden walkways

Don't miss Gifford Homestead's delicious fruit tarts. The store is not accessible.

Cathedral valley:

Cathedral valley is the wildest part of Capitol Reef. The drive to Temple of the Sun and Temple of the Moon is magnificent and worth the detour in itself. A 4 wheel drive vehicle is required for this track, and it is not advisable to use it if it has rained or if the weather is uncertain.

Accessibility:

- A bit of relief, floor made of compacted or loose dirt
- All terrain wheels and assistance recommended





Moonscape overlook:

This viewpoint offers a spectacular panorama. Although the track is in good condition, we strongly advise against using it if it has rained or if the weather is uncertain.

Accessibility:

- A bit of relief
- Floor made of compacted earth or rock
- All terrain wheel recommended



Bentonite hills:

This site offers a beautiful panorama of these multicolored hills. A 4 wheel drive vehicle is required, as the trail begins with a river crossing. We strongly advise you not to use it if it has rained or if the weather is uncertain.

Accessibility:

- A bit of relief et floor made of copacted dirt
- All terrain wheel recommended



Goblin Valley State Park:

MOAB & SURROUNDINGS

MAIN ATTRACTIONS:



Canyonlands National Park:

Location: [click on this link](#)

This geological wonder is sculpted by the Colorado and Green rivers. It is made up of plateaus, deserts, canyons... The park is divided into 3 distinct districts, the only one of interest in terms of accessibility being Island in the sky.

Visitor's center:

Accessibility:

- Disabled parking available
- Accessible restroom

The park can be visited from several viewpoints:

- Green river overlook, Grand view point and Buck canyon overlook offer spectacular panoramas.

Accessibility:

- Disabled parking available
- Accessible restroom
- Concrete floor followed by compacted dirt
- Coleman spring canyon overlook is only accessible by manual wheelchair.

Accessibility:

- A bit of relief
- Floor made of compacted pebbles
- All terrain wheel recommended



Dead Horse Point State Park:

You can admire the meandering Colorado River and the layers of reddish rock characteristic of the region.

The visitor center and main viewpoint are accessible.

Accessibility:

- Disabled parking available
- Accessible restroom
- A bit of relief, concrete floor





Arches National Park:

With over 2,000 natural arches, sandstone domes, spires and canyons carved by the forces of nature into red stone, this park is a must-see.

To protect the park, the administration has set a daily visitor quota during the high season (April-October). You'll need to reserve your entry time. However, if you enter the park before 7 a.m. or after 4 p.m., you don't need to make a reservation.

The visitor's center features a small exhibition to learn more about the park.

Accessibility:

- Disabled parking available and accessible restroom

Several short hikes are possible:

- North south window: it is possible to approach the arch before reaching the stairs.

Accessibility:

- Disabled parking available and accessible restroom
- A bit of relief
- Floor made of compacted pebbles and rock
- Double arch: you can walk almost under the arches, making them even more spectacular.

Accessibility:

- Disabled parking available and accessible restroom
- One step at the beginning of the path
- Floor made of compacted sand, asphalt or rock
- Balanced rock is one of the park's main attractions, with a rock that appears to be balanced.

Accessibility:

- Disabled parking available
- A bit of relief, concrete floor
- Lower delicate arch viewpoint offers a distant view of the park's most emblematic arch.

Accessibility:

- Disabled parking available
- No relief, floor made of gravel and compacted sand



Several viewpoints are remarkable and perfectly accessible: Devils garden campground, Fiery furnace viewpoint, Panorama viewpoint, La sal viewpoint, Garden of eden and Parl ave viewpoint.

Accessibility:

- Disabled parking available at every viewpoints
- Accessible restroom at Devils garden campground, Fiery furnace viewpoint and Panorama viewpoint
- Little or no relief, concrete floor at every viewpoints
- Accessible picnic table at Devils garden campground
